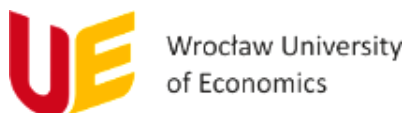

The Wrocław University of Economics is a long-established centre of scientific and educational activities in the region. Professor Kamil Stefko was the first elected Rector of the school. The Higher School of Trade was a single-faculty trade school offering 3-year courses in the following specialisations: General Trade, Cooperative Management, Administration and Public Economy, Trade Insurance. In 1950, the school was nationalised and transformed into Higher School of Economics, with two faculties – Industry and Finance. On 18th of March 2008, by power of an act of the Parliament of the Republic of Poland, the school was formally renamed to Wrocław University of Economics. Today, the University is ranked among the top economic schools of higher education in Poland, an important centre of education, science, and research.
